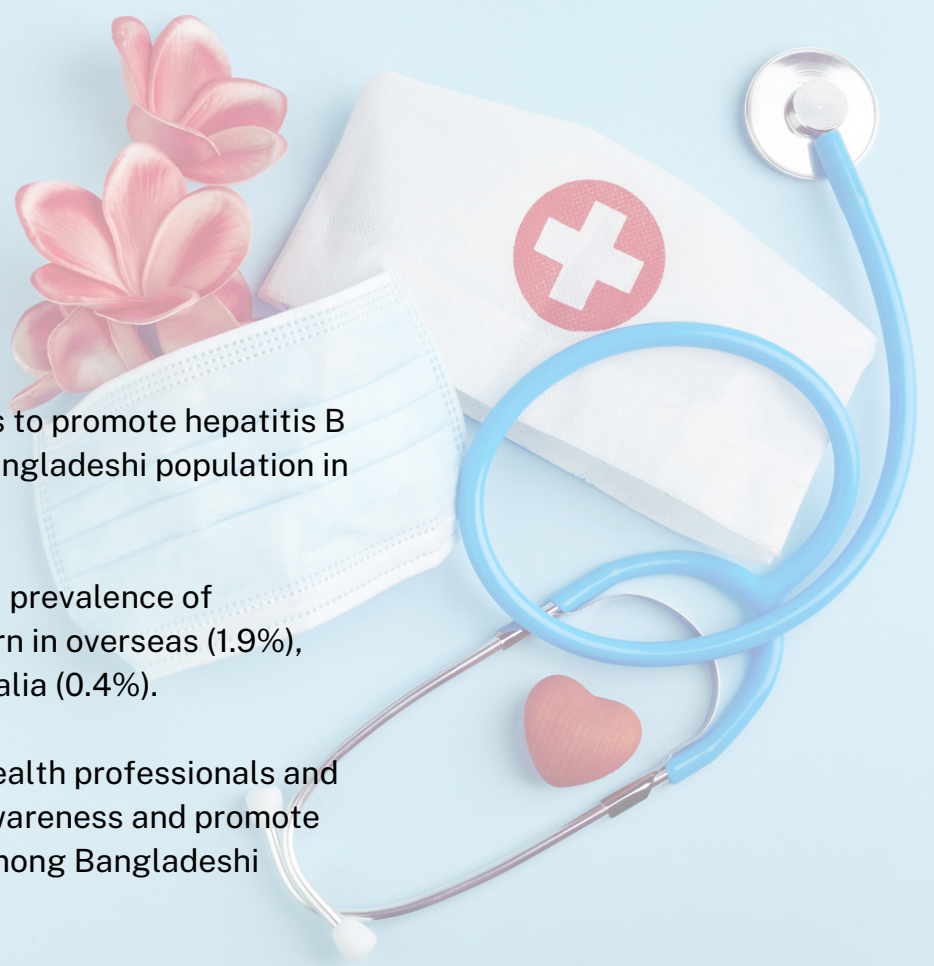


The campaign

The HBV Bangladeshi Campaign aims to promote hepatitis B testing and treatment among the Bangladeshi population in NSW.

Studies suggested that there is high prevalence of Hepatitis B Virus (HBV) in people born in overseas (1.9%), compare to the people born in Australia (0.4%).

We develop this toolkit to support health professionals and community organisations to raise awareness and promote hepatitis B testing and treatment among Bangladeshi patients and communities.



Background

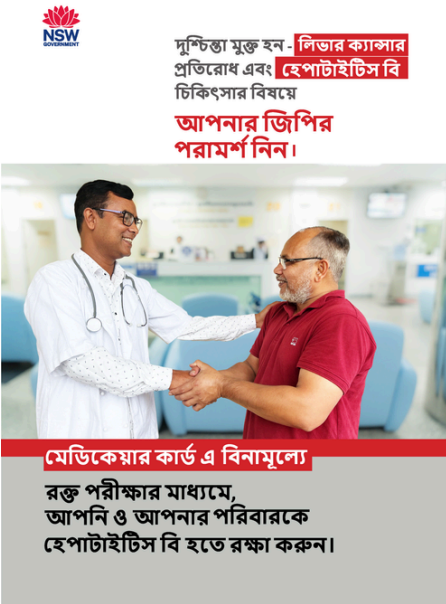
- This campaign, a collaborative effort with the Bangladeshi communities, was co-designed from 2020 to 2023 in the South Eastern Sydney Local Health District.
- Bangladeshi communities were identified as a priority population for Hepatitis B intervention.
- The campaign is implemented in collaboration with South Eastern Sydney, South Western Sydney, Sydney Local Health Districts, and the Multicultural HIV and Hepatitis Service.

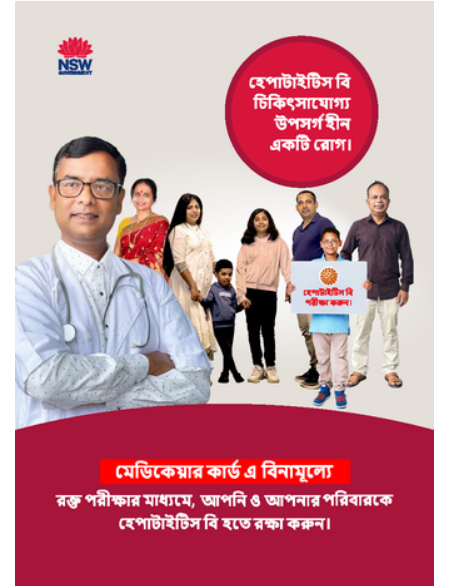
A range of A4 posters in Bengali have been designed to promote hepatitis B testing and raise awareness within Bangladeshi community.

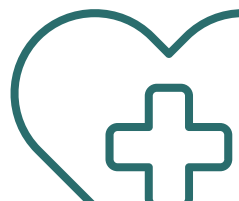
